IT IS, THEREFORE, HEREBY ORDERED, that said petition and the same is hereby approved.

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BY-LAWS OF RECLAMATION DISTRICT CREATED BY ORDER OF  
 THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ON THE 6TH  
 DAY OF JULY, 1909.

The undersigned land owners owning more than the majority of the acreage of the lands of that certain Reclamation District No. 794, situate in

Contra Costa County, State of California, the formation for which the under-  
signed petitioned the said Board of Supervisors to approve and form, and which  
petition was by said Board of Supervisors approved on the 6th day of July,  
1909, hereby adopt the following By-Laws for the government and control of said  
District, to wit:

Said Board of Trustees shall after their election provide for an  
office to be kept in or near said District, in which shall be kept the books  
and records of said District, and may from time to time change the place of  
said office as in the judgment of said Board may seem proper, the convenience  
of the landowners and Trustees of said District considered..

The time for regular meetings of said Board is hereby fixed for  
the first Friday of each month, at the hour of one o'clock, P. M.

Special meetings of the Board or Trustees may be called at any time  
by the President or any two members of said Board.

NOTICE OF MEETINGS.

No notice shall be required of the holding of any regular meetings.

Two days notice by mail shall be given by the Secretary or Presi-  
dent of all Special Meetings; in lieu thereof, personal notice of not less than  
twelve hours given by the Secretary or President to the members of the Board  
shall be sufficient notice of such meeting; provided, however, no notice shall  
be required when there are present at any meeting a full Board, said presence  
being construed to be a waiver of notice.

The Trustees shall employ a Secretary, who shall keep a correct  
record of all proceedings, and proper books of account.

These By-Laws may be amended at any time by the signatures of the  
owners of the majority of the acreage of the lands of the District.

Adopted this 25d day of July, 1909, by the signatures hereto  
of landowners holding more than the majority in acreage of the lands of the  
District.
